### **HUSD's Budget Deficit Roller Coaster: Fact or Fiction?**

Despite a flurry of meetings, town halls, and "input vehicles" about the budget, we still find ourselves lacking critical information about the budget deficit and the contemplated cuts we expect administration to propose in the coming weeks.

When we ended last year, the anticipated budget deficit was roughly \$20 million. By the time we began this year, it had ballooned to \$31 million. As of the 1st Interim Report this year, it is more than \$50 million. Amidst these ever-expanding numbers, the truth remains elusive. Here's what we do know:

Hayward Unified had a \$10 million structural deficit before the pandemic. The pandemic funding made available by the state and federal governments allowed HUSD to avoid budget cuts during (and after) the pandemic, while hiring additional staff to expand learning opportunities and provide additional support. Now that the funding has been exhausted, the District needs to make

difficult cuts to account for both of these situations. We believe that layoffs/cuts are likely for next year and will impact every bargaining unit.

What we don't know is how large the budget deficit is, and how much actually needs to be cut. HEA representatives have been in multiple meetings with district staff asking questions, but still lack clear answers. We have consistently maintained a clear and principled position to our administration, and ask that you join us in amplifying our message:

Every position lost eliminates a service that helps make our school community function. Our students cannot afford to lose their teachers or the staff that make our schools safe places to teach and learn. HEA opposes all cuts to our faculty, staff, and programs. We further demand that any necessary cuts are made as far away from the classroom and our students as possible.

This week, we'll be taking a deeper dive into the budget with the help of CTA and will report back any news of note. In the meantime, prepare to fight against cuts and put the next HUSD board meetings on your calendar. At a time when we are expected to do ever more to improve education and address the needs of each child, we cannot afford to lose the scant resources we have. Make sure the HUSD board understands what cuts could mean for our students, schools and communities!

IFT helps all students and schools by awarding grants directly to CTA members and local chapters. To date, CTA members have funded 643 grant projects totaling more than \$7.6 million (over \$75k of this has funded HEA members' grant projects). All CTA members are eligible to apply for grants - don't miss this opportunity!

Grants available for the 2025-2026 school year include:

- Environmental Education Cohort (NEW!): Up to \$5,000 (Environmental Educator Grant) or \$20,000 (Environmental Impact Grant) for projects focused on environmental education, plus networking opportunities and an in-person convening!
- Educator Grant: Up to \$5,000 for individual educators to impact a classroom or group of students.
- Impact Grant: Up to **\$20,000** for teams of 2 or more educators (3 recommended) to make an impact across multiple classrooms or school sites.
