Layoffs May be Imminent, But We Can't Afford Cuts

More clarity is slowly emerging (leaking?) about the budget cuts being planned by HUSD, although we still do not have any specific details about the programs or positions being cut. The District is currently planning to permanently reduce the budget by \$37 million starting next year, in addition to \$17 million in one-time reductions and budget savings. The vast majority of the \$37 million in cuts will be realized through layoffs (since that's the vast majority of a school's expenses). Our current understanding is that cuts will be spread across every bargaining unit, including administration and the District Office staff.

It didn't have to happen like this. HUSD had a structural deficit of \$10 million even before the pandemic, which was ignored while temporary pandemic funds were used to maintain (and actually increase) staffing. Rather than address this deficit over time, the District chose to kick the can down the road year after year. We're now at the end of the road.

While HEA's own analysis shows the need for substantial budget cuts, we are not in agreement with the total size, and are likely to disagree with the details. HEA representatives have been in multiple meetings with district staff asking questions and discussing possible solutions. We have

consistently maintained a clear and principled position to our administration, and ask that you join us in amplifying our message:

- Every position lost eliminates a service that helps make our school community function.
- Our students cannot afford to lose their teachers or the staff that make our schools safe places to teach and learn.
- HEA opposes all cuts to our faculty, staff, and programs, and demands that any necessary cuts are made as far away from the classroom and our students as possible.

We invite everyone to stand together and share with the HUSD board what each potential cut means to your teaching and your student's learning at school. At a time when we are expected to do ever more to improve education and address the needs of each child, we cannot afford to lose the scant resources we have. Make sure the HUSD board understands what cuts could mean for our students, schools and communities!

Prepare to join us in fighting against cuts, and put the next two HUSD board meetings on your calendar: February 12 and February 26.

When Immigrants Are Under Attack, What Can We Do?

There have been a lot of questions this week about Trump's executive orders on immigration, and the likelihood of ICE or immigration actions at or around our schools.
