

Urgent Action Needed!

Hayward Collegiate, a small K-6 charter school in Hayward that enrolls about 200 students, is seeking approval to expand into middle school and double the size of their K-6 enrollment. Their projected enrollment increase of 340 students over the next several years will end up draining more than \$5 million from HUSD. The Alameda County Board of education is holding a hearing on their expansion this **Tuesday**, **May 14th at 6:30pm**. We need <u>everyone</u> to help us oppose this expansion. There are three actions that we can take between now and Tuesday, and we strongly encourage all HEA members and supporters to take at least ONE action below:

- 1. **If possible, please join us at the hearing on Tuesday 5/14 at 6:30pm**. It will be held at the San Lorenzo Unified School District Boardroom located at 15510 Usher St. in San Lorenzo. Wear your Hayward or HEA gear, so you can show support even if you are unable to speak (speaker time will be very limited).
- 2. Please send <u>personal emails</u> to the Board of Education Trustees expressing your opposition to Hayward Collegiate's expansion. Review the suggested talking points below, but the more personal, the better. Please send messages to all trustees below **before Tuesday 5/14**:

- 3. **Submit written public comments to the Board of education via their website**. You will be commenting on agenda item #9A: Determination Material Revision Hayward Collegiate, and recommending a NO vote on this agenda item.

Based on many conversations we have had with trustees and others, we are strongly recommending the following talking points to use in your messages. Feel free to choose one or more topics below and use the notes as a guide to create your own message. We are always strongest when we talk about our personal experience, and the experiences of our students.

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS:

1. HUSD (like most Bay Area school districts) is facing the twin pressures of declining enrollment and a poor state budget outlook, and carries a very low reserve. The equivalent of 50 FTE classroom positions have already been cut for next year in anticipation of insufficient funding

from the state, and the district closed two elementary schools in the 2022-2023 school year. We are very concerned that Hayward Collegiate's expansion would force additional cuts that will eliminate classes and services our students depend on.

If your elementary or middle school had to cut sections/positions this year, describe those cuts and the impacts on students. Members from Bowman or Strobridge might also talk about the impact of those closures, and the disruption caused to students, staff, and the surrounding community.

- 2. Hayward Collegiate does not provide any programs and services that are new to Hayward schools. In fact, HUSD's programs and services are more extensive than any offered by Hayward Collegiate.
 - Promote HUSD middle and elementary programs you are familiar with, and student success stories that counter Hayward Collegiate's claim that Hayward schools fail students. Especially Middle College, VAPA, and language programs/supports.
- 3. We understand that the parents of Hayward Collegiate students love their small school and feel it serves their students well. We want all parents to feel that way about their kids school. But the cost of their expansion will be harmful to surrounding schools and are likely to result in cuts to programs and services that serve thousands of kids. We can't support a decision that benefits a handful of families at the expense of thousands of other kids in Hayward.

Avoid attacking Hayward Collegiate and their families. Focus on the harm caused to HUSD if additional students and revenue are lost, and advance the idea that the cost of this expansion far outweighs the benefit.

Wednesday's School Board Voting Results

At Wednesday's School Board meeting, the Hayward Board of Education unanimously voted to approve the Tentative 2022-2025 Collective Bargaining Agreement, including the 2% retroactive salary increase effective July 1, 2022 and the 8.5% salary increase effective July 1, 2023.

Once we receive confirmation from the District, we will follow up with folks about the timeline to implement our retroactive salary payments and other important updates.
